Tizoc has a diverse music performance background with more than 20 years of professional experience including mariachi orchestral, choral, rock, jazz, hip hop, and klezmer (European folk music).

A strong believer in the benefits of music education, Tizoc shares his passion for music through teaching. Tizoc is the Band Director at Oxford Preparatory Academy of South Orange County in Mission Viejo, where he teaches marching band to fifth through ninth grade students.

Tizoc has taught at mariachi conferences in Washington and Texas, served as an instructor for Capistrano Community Mariachi Program for three years, and has over 10 years of experience teaching students in band, orchestra and mariachi programs throughout Los Angeles and Orange County.
